YEAR END REPORT 2009

The department started the year with seven full time officers, Chief Brian Zerman, Captain Kenny Underwood, Sergeant Tom Cronenwett, Patrolman Mark Meftah, Patrolman Dustin Gifford, Patrolman Bill Foley, and Patrolman Jarrod Powell. The department also had five Auxiliary/part time officers, Patrolman Casie Newsome, Patrolman Myron Hartman, Patrolman Shari Rice, Patrolman Dustin Stark, and Patrolman Thomas Cory.

By the end of the year Jarrod Powell and Thomas Cory resigned from the department. Patrolman John Hicks was hired as a full time officer in April.


The division's vehicles have held up well with no significant problems. One of the 2008 cruisers was involved in a crash with a deer. The officer was not injured and the cruiser was repaired. By the end of the year the 2004 cruiser had over 119,000 miles, the 2007 had 89,500 miles, the two 2008 cruisers had 47,000 and 51,000 miles respectively. At the end of the year the decision was made to start a K9 program. The 2007 cruiser will be used as the K9 cruiser.

The Auxiliary donated a total of 571 hours to the village for the year. Auxiliary officers help by working parades or other special details and by riding with other officers and assisting as needed. The Auxiliary is a huge benefit to the department and community and their efforts are to be commended.


For the year, the department answered 3,205 calls for service, took 528 reports, handled 74 accidents, and issued 847 charges. In addition the department had 10,232 foot patrols for the year. A foot patrol is when an officer is out of the cruiser checking a building after hours, walking through an open business, or just interacting with citizens for no reason other than to socialize.









Number of calls by day of week






CALLS FOR SERVICE BY MONTH




MOST FREQUENT TYPES OF CALLS




Of the 528 reports taken, 354 were misdemeanors, 112 were felonies, and 62 were unclassified. There was a total of \$95,307.21 worth of property and/or money reported stolen for the year. Officers recovered a total of \$7,619.34 worth of property and/or money.

The following charts will show the most frequent types of reports taken, types of felony reports taken, and the number of reports taken by each officer.


MOST FREQUENT TYPES OF REPORTS




FELONY REPORTS


There were a total of 572 charges issued to males, and 275 charges issued to females. The oldest person charged was 85 and the youngest was 11. There were a total of 200 arrests made for the year, 142 male and 58 female.

Officers conducted 1,209 traffic stops and issued 898 warnings for the year.


The fastest speed violations were as follows; 44 mph in a 20 mph zone, 60 mph in a 25 mph zone, 60 mph in a 35 mph zone, and 70 mph in a 45 mph zone.


MOST FREQUENT TYPES OF CHARGES


