

# **VILLAGE OF MOUNT GILEAD DIVISION OF POLICE**

## **YEAR END REPORT 2011**

The department has seven full time officers; Chief Brian Zerman, Captain Kenny Underwood, Sergeant Tom Cronenwett, Patrolman Dustin Gifford, Detective Bill Foley, Patrolman John Hicks, and Patrolman Adam Lakey. The department started the year with four Auxiliary/part time officers; Patrolman Casie Newsome, Patrolman Shari Rice, Patrolman Dustin Stark, and Patrolman Brandon Ford.

Casie Newsome and Brandon Ford both resigned from the auxiliary. George Hinkle, Cory Galyk, Kevin Kohler, Mark Mclain, and Brett Rinker were all added to the auxiliary unit.

The division's vehicles have held up well with no major repairs being needed. The division currently has four police cruisers. The oldest is a 2007, it is due to be taken out of service with over 125,000 miles. The division is still in need of a storage facility for the cruisers to help protect the village's investment.

The division's office area underwent a much-needed renovation. The improvements created more office space, more equipment storage areas and a better overall appearance.

The Auxiliary donated a total of 1731 hours to the village for the year. It should be noted that some of the auxiliary officers also work part time hours, those hours are not figured into the above number. The auxiliary is still a huge benefit to the department and community and their efforts are to be commended.

STATISTICAL INFORMATION**

For the year, the department answered 3,230 calls for service, took 660 reports, handled 91 accidents, and issued 1085 charges. In addition the department had 8,068 foot patrols for the year. A foot patrol is when an officer is out of the cruiser checking a building after hours, walking through an open business, or just interacting with citizens for no reason other than to socialize.

Of the 660 reports taken, 485 were misdemeanors, 90 were felonies, and 85 were unclassified. There was a total of \$63,880.35 worth of property and/or money reported stolen for the year. Officers recovered a total of \$3,546.27 worth of property and/or money.

The most common type of report taken is a theft report. The department took 194 theft reports, 97 of those reports were taken at local gas stations for fuel drive-offs. We have been working with these businesses to reduce those numbers.

There were a total of 823 charges issued to males, and 262 charges issued to females. The oldest person charged was 80 and the youngest was 9. There were a total of 170 arrests made for the year.

Officers conducted 1444 traffic stops for the year. Out of those traffic stops officers issued 443 warnings for the year.
